All Wales People First have a petition around changes in transport and proper consultation so we have supported this. We have also been discussing getting paid employment and the struggles some people have faced. We have also been working towards the art exhibition.



BRECON

The sensory group has been meeting each month and is growing which is great. We have been doing activities exploring the different senses. This is great fun, especially our touch activities where members have to guess what is in the 'sock'. The group enjoy the music side of the sessions, with a different theme to the music each time. In the self-advocacy session we have been looking at changes that happen in our lives. This can be leaving school, moving out from a family home or getting a job. It has been a success starting the group again and now meet every month. We have discussed a range of topics and the members have decided how they want the groups to run including group rules. 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ENGAGEMENT FORUM MEETING




